#### Horror in Chittagong

At the time of going to press we learn, with regret, of further devastation in Chittagong resulting from a cyclone which struck on 28th May and left in its wake a trail of death and destruction.

None of the Group's ships was in the area at the time but many crew members are recruited from Chittagong and the off-shore islands and we extend our sympathy to those whose families have been affected by this latest disaster.

Readers will recall that in October, 1960, a cyclone and tidal wave, which beached the *Clan Alpine*, resulted in heavy loss of life and widespread damage in East Pakistan.

#### Two killed, five injured

The *Clan Macdonald* shipped a heavy sea during bad weather on 31st May and we regret to report that the Deck Serang and Tindal lost their lives and the Chief Officer, Purser, Cadet and two sailors were injured.

The vessel put back to Fremantle for medical assistance before continuing on her homeward voyage.
