Max Wilson, Managing Director of Travel Savings Association, has announced two 1964 cruises in the *Empress of Britain* exclusively for young people. No reservations will be accepted for anyone over 35.

Says Mr. Wilson: "Young people have not taken to sea cruises, partly because they have the idea these are for older people, and also because they are too expensive. We are a Seaminded nation, and by designing these cruises for under 35's, with top-class entertainment and at a price young

people can afford, I believe we will attract a vast new market which the shipping industry so badly needs."

The first cruise leaves Southampton on 6th April and lasts nine days, calling at Tangier, Gibraltar and Lisbon, returning to Southampton. The second leaves on 17th April, also from Southampton, calls at the same ports but lasts ten days and returns to Liverpool.
