BOOK REVIEW

"The Dustless Road" by CAPTAIN S. J. HARLAND

This is the story of Captain S. J. Harland's life in the Merchant Navy, which is a biography with a difference, since he has done his best to give an insight into his career for those who are interested in taking up the sea. He does not over glamorise the life in any way; in fact, in the opening chapters he is rather discouraging to any young person who is not absolutely sure that a sailor's life is the life for him.

From small cargo tramps to oil tankers, Captain Harland has travelled in them all and manages to bring alive that feeling of adventure that lingers in most of our souls. I would recommend this book even to those who would rather read about life on the high seas in the safety of their homes, but if you are a young man who is looking for some reliable information on a future career, this is the book for you.
