THOMAS GRAY MEMORIAL TRUST BURSARY SCHEME

The Royal Society of Arts, with the help of funds available from the Thomas Gray Memorial Trust, offers in 1967 a "Thomas Gray Memorial Bursary" not exceeding £300 to enable a properly qualified person to undertake an original study on a subject within the objects of the Trust which are "the advancement of the science of navigation and the scientific and educational interests of the British Mercantile Marine".

ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICANTS

Entries may be submitted by any member of the British Merchant Navy, the staff of the shipping companies, the staff of nautical training institutions, or by any other suitably qualified person.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

Each applicant must submit a short statement (of not more than 750 words) explaining the precise nature of the study he proposes to make and his views on its value. The statement should be prefaced by the applicant's name, age and address and a brief summary of his previous career.

The applications should be sent to the Secretary, Royal Society of Arts, 6/8 John Adam Street, Adelphi, London, W.C.2, marked "Thomas Gray Memorial Bursary" by 31st December, 1967.

METHOD OF AWARDED THE BURSARY

The award will be made by the Council of the Society, on the recommendation of the Thomas Gray Memorial Trust Advisory Committee.

The applications, which will be assessed by an expert panel of judges, will be considered chiefly on the nature and practical usefulness of the project and the ability of the applicant to undertake the proposed research.

GENERAL

The bursary must be taken up within twelve months of the announcement of the award unless special circumstances are considered by the Society to justify a deferment. It must be used in the manner agreed between the Royal Society of Arts and the successful candidate, who will be required to produce a thesis reporting in full on the study he has undertaken with the Bursary. No copyright in respect of this report is claimed by the Society, but it reserves the right to reproduce it, or any part of it, in its Journal.

The Council of the Society reserves the right to withhold or divide the award and it may require candidates to attend its House in London for interview (in which case 2nd-class travelling expenses will be refunded).
