John Wilson died in London on May 8 after being ill for some time. He joined Union-Castle Line as carpenter's mate in Kildonan Castle in May 1930, being appointed carpenter of Llandovery Castle in 1935. From 1938 to 1945, he was carpenter of Durban Castle later serving on the maiden voyage of Edinburgh Castle in 1948 and subsequently in Pendemis Castle, Transvaal Castle (later S A Vaal) and S A Oranje. He was awarded the BEM in the New Year's Honours list in 1969.

W. A. Kirkbride died on April 22 at the age of 68, at a Waterloo Nursing Home following a short illness. Kirkbride retired from the company in January 1966 after completing 50 years service in the Liverpool office. He leaves a widow.

H. Oliver died on April 15 aged 83. He joined the company in October 1921 from the Marconi Company being the first radio officer to be engaged by Union-Castle for direct employment. He was first radio officer on the maiden voyage of Athlone Castle in 1936 and in 1938 sailed on the maiden voyage of Capetown Castle. From 1943 to 1947 he served in Stirling Castle and from 1948 until his retirement in 1952 he served in Pretoria Castle.

Captain J. C. Simpson died on April 6 aged 87. He joined Union-Castle in September 1906 and was appointed master in February 1934 in Hansa. He was promoted to passenger vessels in 1936 commanding Gloucester Castle and in 1938 was appointed to command Carnarvon Castle. He resigned for reasons of ill health on December 31, 1940.

Captain J. E. Townrow died on February 24 aged 74. He joined the company in September 1920. In August 1925 he was second officer in Clan Macfadyan and in 1928 was promoted to chief officer, Clan Lindsay. He was promoted master of Halizones in July 1940, his last ship being Hellenes which he commanded in 1956 prior to retirement in January 1957. He leaves a widow.

Captain C. Edwards died on March 3 aged 95. He joined the company in July 1895 as fourth officer and was promoted to chief officer, Clan Macdonald in September 1906. He was promoted master in March 1911 on Clan Mackay, his last ship being Buteshire. In 1926 he came ashore and was appointed marine superintendent, Liverpool, retiring in June 1940.

A. E. King died on March 25 aged 67. He joined Union-Castle as a shipkeeper in marine department, North Woolwich Road, in August 1953. He has subsequently served as gatekeeper and minibus driver for the North Woolwich Road office. He retired in March 1967 and leaves a widow.

Frederick G. Tizard died at the age of 79 after many years ashore and afloat with Union-Castle Line. He joined in 1904 as a deck boy, being promoted AB of Clumy Castle in 1910. In 1922 he joined the seamen's gang at Southampton which was made into the shore gang in 1945. Shortly afterwards he worked for Harland and Wolff, returning to the company in 1949 as a night watchman. He retired in August 1957. His son, Frederick is carpenter on Windsor Castle.
