

obituary

Ernest Kennett Dowsett (known to his friends as Dick) died on April 15 aged 71. He joined Union-Castle Fenchurch Street office on July 22, 1918 and apart from a few months service in freight forwarding department in 1932 his career was spent in the insurance department of which he became head in 1934. He held this position until the formation of the B&C group when he was appointed deputy to R. W. Last in the combined group insurance department. He retired on June 30, 1959.

The death occurred on April 1 of **George Drummond** aged 71. He spent most of his career in the managerial department and rose to become head in 1935. In 1947 he was appointed secretary to the management of Union-Castle Line and then in 1950 he transferred to Bullard King & Co. Limited as manager, subsequently being appointed general manager of that company in 1954 and director in 1956. He retired on September 30, 1959.

Leonard Charles Barnes died on February 25 aged 89. He joined Union-Castle at the Fenchurch Street office on December 28, 1910 and served throughout his career in the inward freight department, retiring on July 18, 1958.

Victor George Linegar died on February 4 aged 68. He joined the accounts department on July 28, 1920 and during the war served with the RNVF, being appointed to the accounting section of the passenger department on his return. In 1960 this function was transferred to the newly formed passenger accounting section within the accounts department where he continued to serve until his retirement on February 1, 1965.

A. W. B. Hunt died on February 23 aged 72. He joined the company as a ganger in the London docks in 1920, and in 1940 he became a firewatcher at the Fenchurch Street office until he joined HM Forces in 1942. After demobilisation he resumed his service with the stevedoring services, being appointed assistant storekeeper in 1952. These activities subsequently came under the jurisdiction of the London & Southampton Stevedoring Co. Limited, from which he retired on August 31, 1965.

The death occurred on April 19 at Wythenshawe Hospital, Manchester, of **Arthur Carroll**, aged 71. Arthur was a member of the Liverpool office staff and head of the bill of lading department for some years prior to his retirement. He served on the Ormskirk UD Council for 11 years and was chairman in 1954-55.

E. J. Hunt died on April 16 aged 73. He joined the company in 1947 as a lift attendant and his last ship before retiring

on May 14, 1965 was *Pretoria Castle*, now *S A Oranje*.

Capt. A. S. R. Parker died on March 3 aged 94. He joined Union-Castle on April 18, 1910 and gained his first command on April 23, 1937. His last ship before retiring on May 19, 1942 was the old *Windsor Castle*.

Richard Bulmer, storekeeper for BIA at Blackpool, died after a long illness on February 24. He joined the group in 1948.

Mrs. Elizabeth Le Feuvre, until recently BIA reservations supervisor, Jersey, died on March 10.
